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this new second edition includes two entirely new chapters on selecting vocabulary words for study and vocabulary instruction for english language learners in addition every chapter has been substantially updated to incorporate discussion of next generation standards incorporating the newest research in vocabulary acquisition into the four part model of vocabulary instruction that made the first edition a bestseller this edition emphasizes vocabulary as an important tool in meeting the needs of increasingly diverse students k 12 it also includes new instructional approaches to teaching vocabulary that have been developed and classroom tested since the release of the first edition

reading ability and vocabulary knowledge are two of the most important components of performance in a second language especially in academic settings each depend on the other as vocabulary knowledge is the single most important factor in reading comprehension while reading is the single most important means by which intermediate and advanced learners acquire new words this symbiotic relationship is the subject of this volume the authors argue that building vocabulary through reading is a fruitful but complex activity that needs better understanding and more careful guidance this book is unique in its emphases on original research eight of the 14 chapters are empirical studies published

for the first time including classroom based case studies experimental research and think aloud protocol analysis in every chapter consideration is given to the pedagogical implications and possible applications of the research findings lengthy editorial comments at the end of each chapter reinforce this practical concern

the challenges textbook series helps students become better readers through explicit teaching of reading skills and strategies that will break counter productive habits such as word for word translation vocabulary is a major focus of the series as well because good readers know a lot of words challenges 1 the low intermediate level has eight units with two chapters in each each unit begins with an introduction to the topic generally a one page activity to activate students interest and background knowledge each chapter consists of sections designed to support students understanding of a reading passage for example the reading skills section teaches one of three types basic reading skills dictionary skills or sentence level grammar skills vocabulary is also previewed but students also practice word forms of the target vocabulary and learn common collocations and phrases the book also includes timed paced readings which are important to developing reading fluency additional material to support the book is available online
